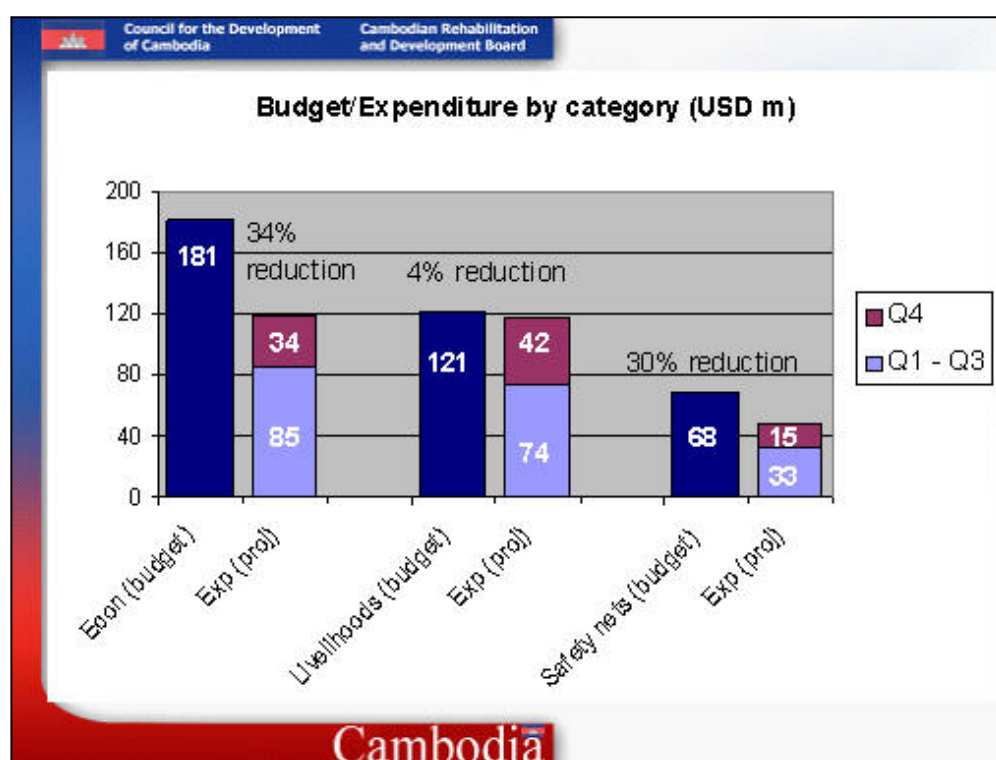
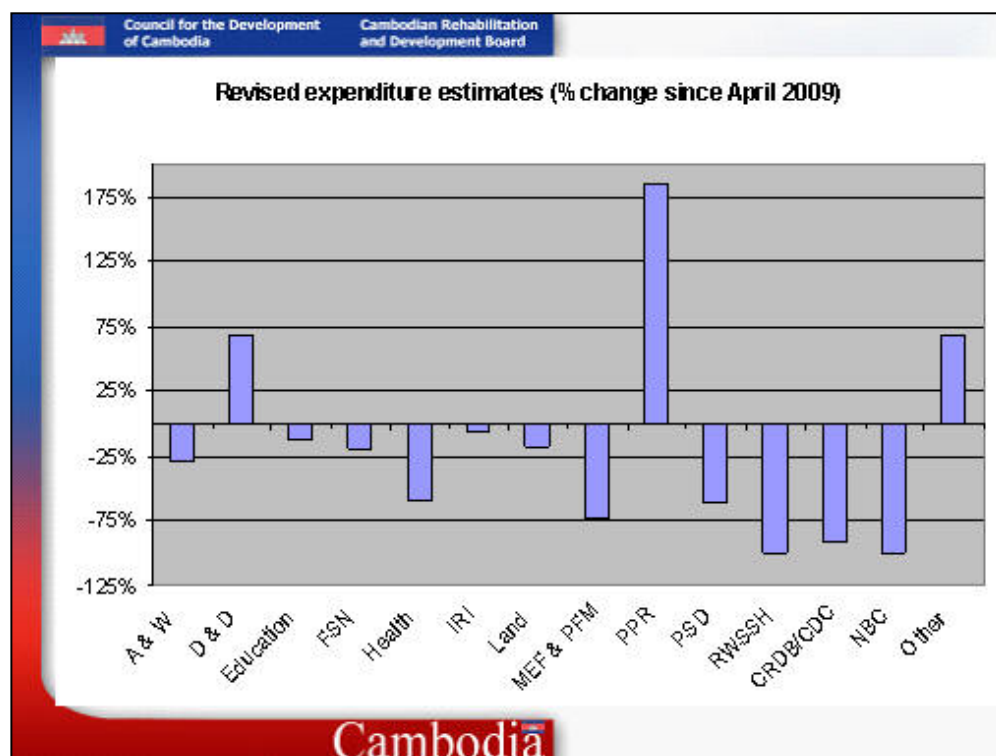

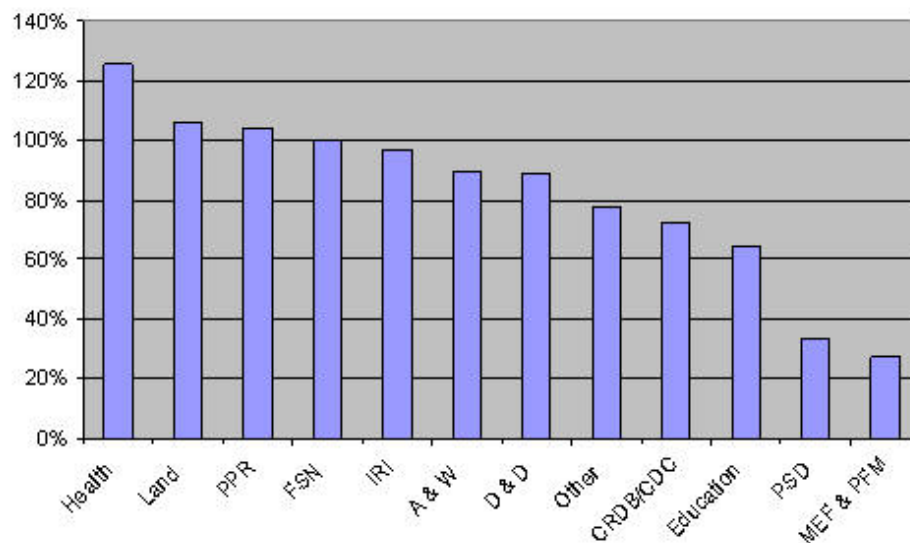
**Budgeted and Projected Expenditure (2009 USD million)**

## Joint Monitoring Indicators

- Evidence of implementation and cooperation between the RGC and DPs
- Good progress in JMI 4 on deliveries attended by skilled health personnel
- 9 of the 20 JMIs reported no constraints or challenges
- For 11 of the 20 JMIs, the primary challenge appears to be associated with resources – financial, human, and technical
- Aid effectiveness JMIs are broadly on-track
- Continue to position and implement the aid effectiveness work: (1) at the sector level, and, (2) through the core reforms

"Remaining challenges extend beyond the immediate mandate of aid effectiveness initiatives. Strengthening NSDP-budget linkages, public service capacity and incentives, and service delivery require continued implementation of the core reforms but with improved integration of aid effectiveness practices that combine system-wide objectives with sector-specific priorities."
