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Main messages of the 2010 AER

- Development Assistance to Cambodia continue to grow (USD 989.5 million in 2009, increasing to > \$1 billion in 2010).
- Leadership and capacity remain the most likely route to impact at sector level
- Increased focus on link to outcome-level results shows positive development in aid effectiveness policy
- Opportunity for applying & extending PBAs to support:
 - harmonising/integrating budget / planning / aid systems
 - focus TC on capacity development (managing core reforms)
 - addressing aid fragmentation
 - strengthening partnership dynamics



Activities 2009-2010...and beyond

- CDC support to TWGs & GDCC
 - PBA “clinics” – tailored support to move agenda forward
 - Capacity linked to “integration”, reforms, systems
 - GDCC to focus on key reforms and results (JMIs)
- JMIs and aid effectiveness link
 - PBAs
 - Use of national systems / capacity (M&E)
 - Partnership principles / dynamics
- “Making partnerships effective”
- Evaluation of the Paris Declaration

Policy direction is clear - momentum for implementation must be sustained

- Consensus on key issues for implementation
 - JMIs linked to sector outcomes & development results
 - PBAs and support to sector work
 - Use of national systems & coordinated capacity inputs

 - Use of GDCC to monitor JMIs & key reforms
- RGC and development partner commitment to build on recent progress
