Progress in implementation

- Much higher profile for JMIs in sector work
- Improved links to routine sector work
- Less “conditionality” feature \Rightarrow increased ownership
- Foundation for future partnership and results focus

1	NSDP	AOP a basis for organisational support
2	Aid management	AE actions applied at sector level
3-6	Social sectors	Good progress, almost all met
7-12	Economic sectors	All complete or in progress
13-14	Infrastructure	Slower progress than anticipated
15-20	Governance/x-cutting	Fully or partially met

2010 JMIs - principles & process

- 2008 CDCF agrees need to revise format and approach to focus on results
- 'Process drives product' – grounds for optimism
- JMI principles increasingly applied to 2010 JMI process (dialogue, sector links, partnership)
- More emphasis on joint actions and individual responsibilities
- Opportunity for closer links to efforts to secure aid effectiveness
- 2010 JMIs therefore presented for endorsement
