Promotion of non-ODA partnerships that drive development results

Private sector

- Strengthening the enabling environment
- Promoting economic competitiveness
- Infrastructure development
- Direct partnerships with the private sector

NGO support to service delivery

- Align the significant financial resources of NGOs to RGC priorities
- Develop closer relations to support rapid response to disaster etc
- Recognise and engage as a partner with significant expertise & experience

South-South & Triangular Cooperation

- Ensure policies and mechanisms are in place to maximise provision and learning
- Linkage to wider sector programmes (i.e. aligned and harmonised with sector plan)
- Improve procedures for identifying need and matching to suitable partners

CDCF – evolving to Cambodia Development Forum (CDF)

- Meeting every two years
- Progressive evolution (more national stakeholder participation)
 - Beginning with back-to-back CDCF & G-PSF
- Focus on broader development issues (not ODA-specific)
- Multi-stakeholder perspectives & dialogue → joint solutions





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GDCC (annual)

- Meets annually
- Main forum for ODA-specific issues
 - NSDP review
 - JMIs
 - Reforms
 - Donor pledges
- Quarterly meeting between Chair/CDC and Lead DP/others to discuss prevalent issues and follow-up





Technical Working Groups (TWGs)

- Relatively unchanged (i.e. a mix of arrangements around a common Guideline, including promotion of PBAs)
- TWGs requested to review structure and working arrangements
- More focus on links to results, especially through:
 - Adoption and use of results frameworks
 - Capacity and systems strengthening (links to reforms)
 - Attention to cross-cutting issues (gender, climate change)
 - Promoting peer learning TWG Network
- Increased use of informal dialogue / smaller meetings
- Annual performance reviews (input to annual GDCC)

Bilateral consultations

- Need to raise the profile of their strategic focus to consider the context of sector/area of work
- Promote the application of results-based approaches and contributions to sector/national programs
- Portfolio reviews to consider partnerships (e.g. opportunities for private sector, S-S, CSO dialogue)
- Additional focus on use of country systems, support to capacity/systems development





Private sector consultations

- Emphasizing continuity with the Government-Private Sector Forum and its 8 working groups
- Government-Private Sector Forum to meet annually
- Promotion of additional channels of dialogue for development partners to support private sector development
- Preparing PS for engaging with the Cambodia Development Forum





NGO consultations (annual)

- New annual consultative meeting is intended to:
 - support the implementation of national/sectoral plans
 - identify shared goals and appropriate actions for Government & NGOs
 - Agree scope for joint activity that promotes development effectiveness
- Primary objective is to:
 - promote mutual understanding
 - strengthen information sharing on progress, challenges and solutions
 - Provide for an effective follow-up mechanism
