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Background

- Build on the good achievements in growth and poverty reduction during 2009-2013
- Concentrate on deepening the process of development: broaden the current narrow economic base and increase productivity
- Distribute gains of development to all
- Effectively integrate into ASEAN (2015)
- Adjust to current global economic crisis
- Restructure the architecture of the economy to being MIC, and live without large international assistance (grants will reduce)

Objectives – RSIII

- 1. Ensuring annual **economic growth** at 7%. Growth to be sustainable, inclusive, equitable and resilient to shocks thru diversified economic base & competitive economy. Low inflation, stable exchange rate & steady growth in international reserves.
- 2. Creating more **jobs** especially for youth thru further improvement in competitiveness to attract domestic and foreign investments.
- 3. Achieving ≥ 1% reduction in poverty rate annually, realizing CMDG targets, placing higher priority on human resources and sustainable management environmental and natural resources.
- 4. Further strengthening institutional capacity and governance at all levels, and ensuring the effectiveness and efficiency of public services.

Implementation Process – General

- Make firm and transparent decisions and time-bound execution
- Establish rule-based processes
- Strengthen conflict-resolution mechanisms incl. courts
- Reform civilian and military bureaucracies and build capacities – insist on delivery and results
- Make special attempts for integration into ASEAN match tax rates, increase trade and investments, labor laws and migration, human capital and TOT/indigenization

Special attention: Land Laws and Implementation

Implementation Process – D&D

Continue strengthening the **D&D Process**

Offer more financial autonomy at sub-national levels

Provide greater devolution of powers and authority to sub-national levels

Concentrate on **building capacities** at subnational levels

Strengthen database for local level planning and M&E

New M&E Architecture

- M&E Architecture to emerge from Results Framework for M&E for the economy and society
- 2. Develop a hierarchy of M&E processes to link inputs with implementation, then with outputs, and finally with outcomes and impacts (i.e. from projects to programs to sectors, & to the national level and with budgets)
- 3. Have a component of national M&E Architecture to address sub-national issues
- Conduct special studies to establish relationships and bottlenecks
- Integrate Outcome Monitoring Process with JMIs (under discussion...suggestions invited)

New M&E Architecture

NSDP 2014-2018 has identified key <u>Outcome / Impact</u> Indicators to match with *RSIII*. The performance on these indicators would be matched against the <u>set targets</u> at the beginning of the plan – e.g. poverty reduction, GDP growth, others.

Each target is so set to be broadly consistent with the sectoral programs (outputs) and the associated budgets (inputs). Put conversely, each ministry is expected to draw up their programs and budgets/strategies to be consistent with the national targets. In either case, national targets & activities are linked to RFs at sectoral/sub-national levels.

New M&E Architecture (cont')

Create new indicators to capture hitherto unmonitored processes

Liberally use proxy indicators

Strengthen database at both national and sub-national levels

Strengthen and standardize data generating processes

Strengthen Administrative databases

Strengthen statistical literacy at all levels

Special focus: Data Generating Process and quality data

M&E: Highest level, 20 core key indicators

- (1) <u>Sustainable Growth</u>: Real GDP Growth Rate, Per-capita GDP, Inclusive Growth Index, GDP Structure, Paddy Yield Rate, %Forest Cover, Total Cumulative Areas Cleared of Mines/ERW
- (2) <u>Poverty Reduction</u>: Poverty Rate, Gini Coefficient of consumption Inequality
- (3) Stability: Investment Rate
- (4) Human Development
- Education and Skills: Completion Rate Grade 6, Completion Rate Grade 9, Skill Level (Index)
- Gender: % Women Holding Decision-making Positions in Public Sectors
- Health: Attended Births, IMR, % Stunted Children, MMR
- Water and Sanitation: % Population Having Access to Safe Water, % Population Having Access to Improved Sanitation

M&E: Outcome level, 47 core key indicators

Project and Program-level Indicators to be maintained by implementing ministries and agencies as per the RF developed for each program

A list of tentative output/sectoral 90 indicators are identified by the NWGM&E, but ministries and departments have the prerogative to make their own indicators
